rare for any transit agency, and Mr. Keenan would like to thank MTS staff, Monroe City staff, and North Delta staff for aiding in this achievement.



I am pleased to write a letter on behalf of the City of West Monroe in support of the proposal "Safe Streets and Roads for All Action Plan: Ouachita Council of Governments" being submitted to the Safe Streets and Roads for All Discretionary Grant Program by the North Delta Regional Planning and Development District through the Ouachita Council of Governments (OCOG).

This letter conveys the city's support of the Action Plan grant and the Ouachita Council of Government's efforts to enhance and promote safety throughout Ouachita Parish. If the proposal submitted by North Delta Regional Planning and Development District is selected for funding, it is the intent of the City of West Monroe to partner and commit .0991% of the funds needed to reach a 20% match, based on the city's population, as detailed in the Budget section of the proposal.


